






Hello! I am Tawanda G. Harris. I was born in Newark, NJ at the Newark Beth Israel Hospital in 1971. I was born to the proud parents of Lonnie and Dorothy Hicks on November 16th. I am the 6th child out of the 8 children. I am better known as the "knee" baby of the family.

The question was asked; who am I? I am a Devoted Friend, Wife and Mother of one beautiful teenage daughter. I'm an Elect-Woman of God. I bare the fruits of the Spirit. I am "Praise". I am worship. I am the apple of my father's eye. There are many gifts that God has invested in me, such as strength, wisdom, knowledge, and spiritual integrity.

Who am I? I attended West Side High School. Graduated in 1989 ready to face the world.

Who am I? I am a nurturer. I am a wife that holds my husband's head during his seizures; I am the woman that helps him to feel better. I am a daughter, who continues to take care of my ailing mother; I am also a daughter that tried to breathe life into my father, when he suffered a heart attack. I am a sister that helped care for my siblings while they were losing their battles with cancer. I am a mother that nurtures and encourages my daughter, to be better than her mother, and to follow her own dreams. I am a friend that lends a hand and heart wherever it's needed. I am a woman that has put her dreams on the back burner to simmer, while not losing focus of my plans for the future.

Who am I? I am that girl in the summer of 1999, that decided that I needed to do something better for myself, so I enrolled and completed a CNA course. The certificate course opened many doors for me in the health care system. It allowed me to obtain a full-time position at the Saint Barnabas Medical Center. I can remember the day I became an employee, September 7th, 1999. That's when I developed my interest to further my nursing career.

The first time I truly touched a person's life, although the encounter was brief it was surprisingly fulfilling. A strong

feeling of accomplishment and self-worth spread rapidly throughout my heart and soul that no average "good deed" has ever accomplished after each experience. That one moment left me with such an over struck attitude of purpose, knowing that I am needed in someone's life.

Working in the hospital as a CNA has allowed me to realize that I can make a difference in many lives. The doctors and the nurses have inspired me to return to school and further my nursing education. Nursing is a commitment to care for others. At this present time in my life, I am ready to take the next step.

This was done with urgency. She was an ambassador in the army spreading across the world with a vision to reach her own people for Christ... God gave her the message and she was faithful to every word.

She enjoyed cooking for others and felt really good about it. She realized that cooking brought us together; family, church, community and with cooking came feelings of connection and happiness. On various occasion, Tawanda hosted catering events while her close friend Kendra assisted with the events decorations. Tawanda knew the psychological benefits about cooking - there's a cumulative effect, it's self-care, it's taking care of others, it's physical care, it's mindfulness, and she knew it hits on meeting basic needs for herself and others.

THE NURSE

Tawanda was employed at Saint Barnabas Medical Center, Livingston, NJ for over 20 years as a Nurse Assistant. She also worked in the emergency room during COVID-19. She was a compassionate caregiver, an advocate and leader as she made significant contributions to improving her patients. Her diverse skill set, dedication and commitment to excellence was instrumental in her ensuring high quality to all her patients. Returning to school, Union County Nursing School Program, was a long journey for Tawanda. When it was time to take the final exam, her sickness thwarted the process - only one day to join Deborah and Shiprah, two women in the Bible who prevented a genocide. Exodus 1:15-21.

Receiving many awards and honors just to name a few. Just recently she was honored by Pastor Donald C. Francis, First SDA Church of Paterson, for being a healthcare worker during the COVID-19 pandemic. She was also awarded The C.A.R.I.N.G Team Award for Excellence from Saint Barnabas Medical Center. She was "Nurse T" for all her family and friends. Prescribing care for each one of us.....
